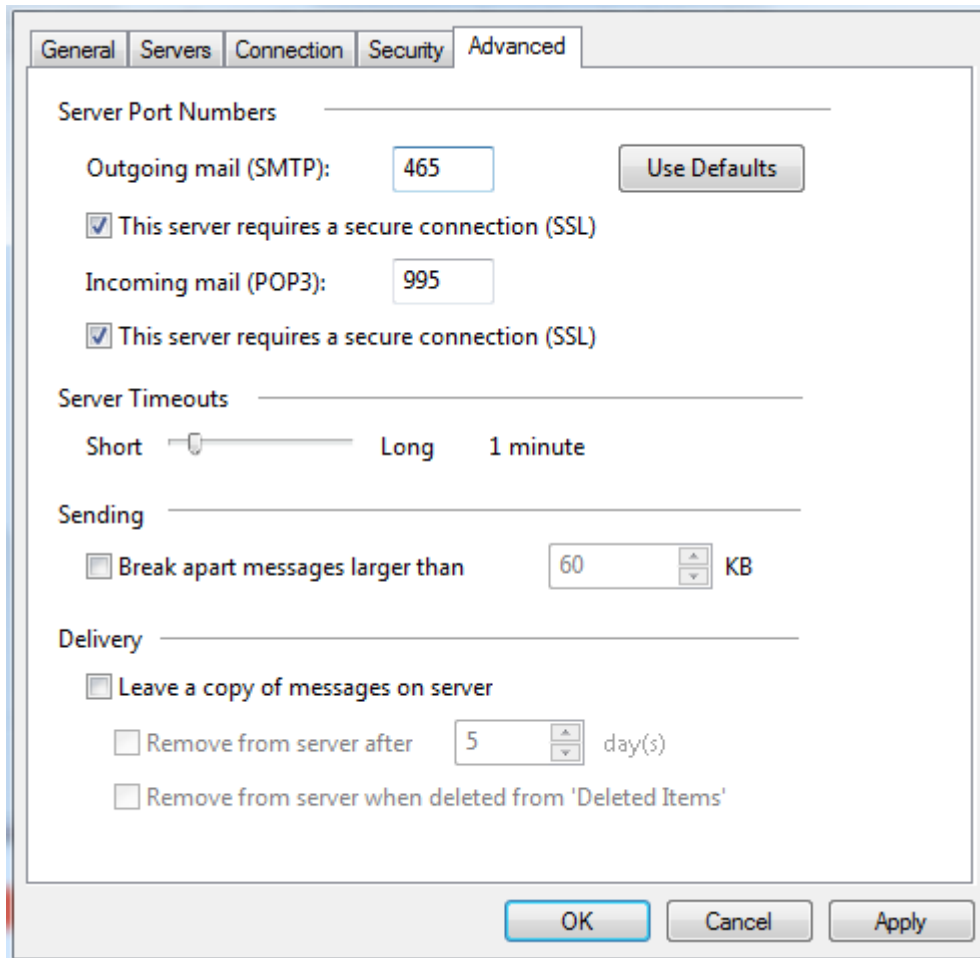


Windows Mail

1. Open Windows Mail.
2. Click the **Tools** menu, and select **Accounts...**
3. Click the Mail tab, select your POP account and click **Properties**.

4. Click on the **Servers** Tab and change the following fields:
POP server: pop.gmail.com
SMTP server: smtp.gmail.com
5. Check the box next to **My server requires authentication**.
6. Click the **Advanced** tab.



7. Enter **465** in the in the box next to **Outgoing mail (SMTP)**, and check the box next to **This server requires an encrypted connection (SSL)**.
8. Check the box next to **This server requires an encrypted connection (SSL)** under **Incoming mail (POP3)**. The box next to **Incoming mail (POP3)** should automatically update to **995**.
9. Click **OK**.
